The Position of Chair of the Executive Committee of the Old Southendian Association

As you may be aware, Clive Shiret has advised the Executive Committee that he will not be seeking reelection to the Chair of the Committee at this November's Annual General Meeting. The Succession Sub-Committee of the Executive Committee is tasked with seeking a successor to Clive and applications for the position are now invited from the membership, initially for a three-year term.

If you wish to be considered for the position, please submit an email of application demonstrating your suitability for the role to the undersigned by Monday, 5th September 2022. The Succession Sub-Committee will then shortlist and interview applicants, before putting its nomination to the Executive Committee for approval prior to the Annual General Meeting to be held on 9th November next.
