Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Old Southendian Association held at The Southendian Club, Garon Park, Southend on Sea, Essex on Wednesday, 8th November 2023 commencing at 7.45 pm.

Item	Minute		
1.0	Apologies for Absence had been received from Karl Anderson, Dr Robin Bevan, John Goodman, Graham Glover, James Masson, Geoff May, Andrew Sargeant and Graham Winckless.		
2.0	Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 9 th November 2022:		
	The Minutes were accepted unanimously on a proposal by John Roy, seconded by Martin Stansfield and signed by the Chairman.		
3.0	Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of 9 th November 2022:		
	There were none.		
4.0	Chairman's Report:		
4.1	Andy Crow's report had been circulated prior to the meeting. His first year as Chair of the Association's Executive Committee had helped him understand the efforts of many members to grow the Association and maintain the strong links with the School. He thanked them for their efforts. He had attended many events at the School and been impressed with the high standards of the School and its students.		
4.2	The membership of the Executive Committee now included 3 ladies and several members under 30 and Andy felt this was a trend that must be encouraged to understand what recent former students wanted from the Association and how it could support them. Sixty-five new members had joined from the 2023 leavers and this was an improvement on the numbers that were able to be attracted in the "Covid Years".		
4.3	The Associated Clubs and Societies continued to flourish and were so important in maintaining those friendships formed through the School. It was hoped to produce a Magazine early in 2024.		
5.0	Treasurer's Report and Presentation of the Audited Accounts to 31st March 2023:		
5.1	Dan Garside reported on the financial position of the Association and confirmed that income had broadly remained consistent but expenditure had fallen slightly, meaning that the surplus for the year had grown to £3,536 (compared to £2,966 in 2022). Reserves stood at a very healthy £46,639.		
5.2	The Association had again been able to support the School financially at its annual Prizegiving and was very pleased to mark Clive Shiret's incredible service as Chair of the Executive Committee with a gift of a tankard.		
5.3	In his Presidential year, Dan had campaigned that current members of the Association should recruit "Just one more" member from their friendship group to drive the membership of the Association, so that it remained well placed to support the School in its <i>ad hoc</i> projects and ensure it strengthened its own foundations as being the best alumni network around.		
5.4	The Accounts for the year ended 31 st March 2023 were adopted on a proposal by Clive Shiret, seconded by Jim Harrington.

6.0	Report of Sub Committees, the School, the Clubs and the Affiliated Organisations:				
6.1	The School. In tendering his apologies, Dr Robin Bevan had thanked the Association for their unwavering				
	support of the School in the past year.				
6.2	Old Southendian Bowls Circle. Trevor Johnson's report had been circulated and it confirmed that the				
0.2	Circle had had a successful season with a total of 33 members playing some 20 outdoor fixtures, winning				
	15, losing 4 and with one abandonment. during the Summer. The indoor season was now underway. A				
	pre-season pub lunch had been enjoyed by 21 members; it was hoped to repeat the occasion in April.				
6.3	Old Southendian Golf Circle. Jim Harrington reported that the Circle enjoyed 4 events throughout the				
0.5	year as well as a successful tour to Sandwich. Graham Winckless was stepping down as the Circle's				
	representative on the Executive Committee and would be succeeded by Steve Clarke.				
6.4	Old Southendian & Southchurch Cricket Club. Woody Marron's report had been circulated and				
0.4	reported a mixed season for the Club's 5 Saturday sides, the highlight being promotion for the 2 nd XI				
	after the disappointment of last season's relegation. The Club continued to invest heavily in his youth				
	section through winter coaching and other initiatives (including experiencing the Rajasthan Royals IPL				
	facilities in India) to give invaluable opportunities for youngsters, including many current students at the				
	School, to compete at a good standard of adult cricket. For the 85 th time, the Club ran a tour to Sussex;				
	this one was very successful and the Club won all three games played.				
6.5	Old Southendian Football Club. Andy Crow and John Roy reported that the Club was sadly running only				
0.5	2 Saturday teams now, the 1st XI and the Reserves, although it still ran 3 Sunday teams, the 1st XI being				
	mainly comprised of youth players. There was a big gulf between Youth and Men's football and no link				
	between the two, despite the strength of football in the School and the Club's links to the School.				
6.6	Old Southendian Hockey Club. Jack Stevenson reported that the Club was now the largest in the county,				
0.0	with 6 men's sides and 4 ladies' sides. The highlight of the last year had been the opportunity to train				
	with the Hong Kong national team.				
6.7	Old Southendian Organ Society. Joe Zammit's report had been circulated. It celebrated the seven events				
0.7	that the Society had organised and continued to enjoy to mark the centenary year of the War Memorial				
	Organ's original installation. These included an opening recital by the Society's President, Adrian Lucas,				
	workshops, other recitals, a "Showcase" featuring School musicians past and present and, still to come,				
	a <i>Cantare</i> concert just before Christmas. A number of the events were already on the Society's				
	increasingly popular YouTube channel. The Society continued to offer support to the School to maintain				
	the tradition of student organists and had also ensured that the instrument itself was regular				
	maintained and tuned. The Society remained grateful to the School and to its members and donors				
	without who it would not be able to provide this support or stage these events.				
	The Chairman commended to the meeting Joe's fantastic efforts in driving the Society to such great				
	heights.
